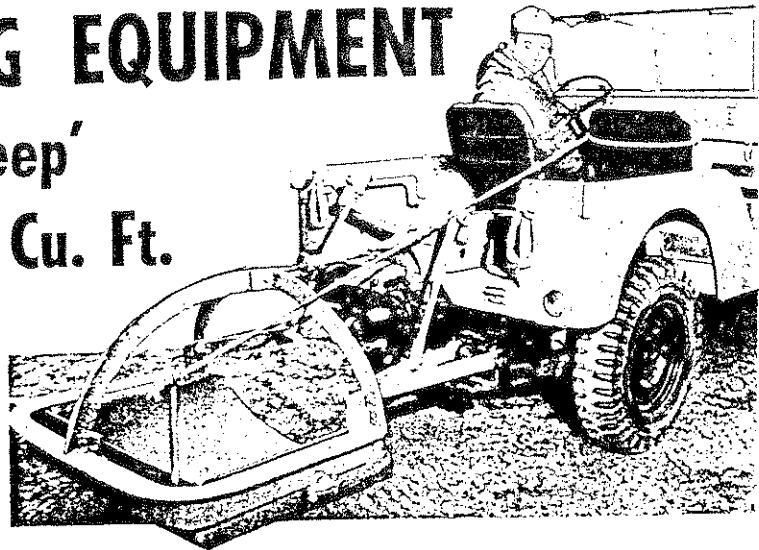

Jeep accessories, part 17: The hot weather is really upon us now. Harold has a nice big pool in his back yard. Wouldn't that be great? How about using the versatile Universal Jeep to build one? Well, a few neat accessories will allow you to completely remodel your back yard. You can use the scoop to dig the hole and then use the grader blade to contour the border. My stock of old literature does not include a Jeep mounted/powerd cement mixer, so improvise. As to plumbing, you are on your own, although the Jeep will help you to haul things. It's probably more efficient to just stand under the sprinkler.

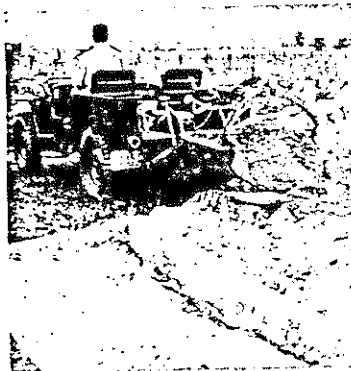
EARTH MOVING EQUIPMENT

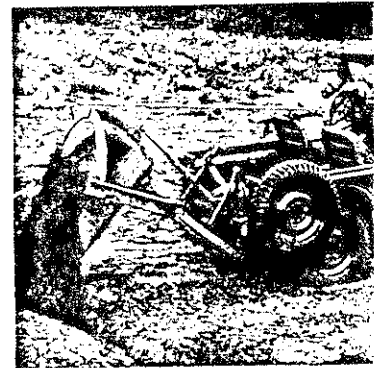

Ideal for digging ditches, landscaping, terracing, leveling, filling gullies and washouts, backfilling, or levee, dam, road, basement and pond building.

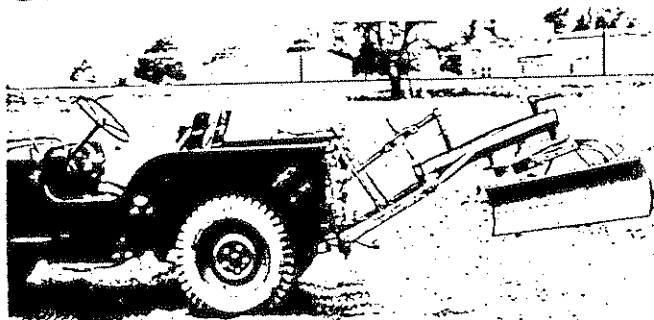
