Minutes:

Minutes of the January 9, 2001 Pizza Party and Meeting of the Military Transport Association of North Jersey. In the vastly overcrowded side room of Godfather's Pizza Restaurant, President John Sobotka called the meeting to order at 8:09 p.m.

Three new members were welcomed: Steve Stecko, Harold Alle, and Hank Douma. Hank recently purchased a '46 or '47 CJ2A which he and Harold intend to restore as a military jeep. Steve has 20 years with the National Guard in Morristown as a mechanic but has no MV of his own at present.

The minutes of the last meeting were accepted as printed in the newsletter. Both the secretary and backup secretary were absent, so a second alternative (Anna Marie Bancale) was enlisted for the recording of the minutes.

The treasurer was also absent, but had sent along his report via President Sobotka. It indicated an opening balance of \$3929.47, deposits of \$360.00 from renewal memberships and \$37.00 from the 50-50; a disbursement of \$101.69 for the January newsletter, leaving a new balance of \$4224.78.

Mr. Sobotka announced that he had the list that Mr. Ahl had created of the 50 members who owed dues for 2001 and that he would be happy to take their money to give to the treasurer.

Because of the season, there is not yet much parade activity, but Mr. Axelrad would like to know what vehicles are going to be available for parades this coming spring and summer. It was noted that the turnout for the Clifton parade was quite astounding. The MTA really made a lasting impression and people are still talking about our showing.

The jacket committee is working on getting together a proposal to obtain jackets for club members. The committee is leaning toward a khaki jacket to match our hats with the MTA

logo embroidered on the back and maybe an American flag on the shoulder. The thinking is that the jackets would be free to members for driving in a certain minimum number of parades while others would pay a nominal amount for one. Details to be spelled out next meeting.

Kudos were offered for the January newsletter with the color photo insert. Thanks to Dave Steinert and Dave Ahl.

Looking further into the M38A1 restoration project for the National Guard museum, Mr. Sobotka and Mr. Bancale took another trip down to Lawrenceville to inspect the vehicle. The final assessment is that the restoration is a doable project. It will take a lot of elbow gerease and maybe some bartering, but there should be little or no monetary cost to the club. Sandblasting (John Peterson) and painting (Joe Botto) has been offered and Sherwin-Williams has offered to furnish paint. Twelve members have volunteered to work on the project. Mr. Sobotka asked for and received a vote of confidence to proceed.

As a club, we did great for the USMC Toys for Tota Program. We donated a deuce-and-a-half load of more than 150 toys to the program on behalf of the MTA (photos on pg 2).

Field jacket zippers were donated to the club by Joe Botto. If you need a zipper, see Mr. Sobotka.

Mr. Sobotka also announced that he had T-shirts available for any member who did not get one. See him after the meeting.

It was mentioned that some vendors give discounts (sometimes as much as 25%) to MTA members on their purchases. The opinion was expressed that we should patronize these vendors or they may stop offering a discount. Weebee Webbing, for example, offers a discount to club members on canvas items; stop by their table at Tobyhanna.

Details were not available, but a trail ride is in the works for later this year near the town of Jefferson. Current plans call for marking out several trails over both easy and rough terrain.

Remember the Red Ball Swap Meet at Tobyhanna on Saturday, February 10. It always snows, but don't let that stop you.

Jim Moore bought an M37 for restoration from Don Covart. Go to it, Jim!

Frank Eichenlaub donated a number of military-type video tapes to the club. If you want to borrow one, see Mr. Sobotka. And please return previously-borrowed tapes!

A suggestion was made to try and find another place for the monthly club meeting as we have outgrown Godfather's Pizza. Two people suggested the Whippany American Legion Hall, which is free on Monday. It has lots of room available for showing videos, offering seminars, holding mini swap meets, and more. It will cost money (about \$75/month), but it may be possible to work out some kind of barter arrangement. Mr. Sobotka will look into this.

Patches were not in at the meeting, but they are now. Jude Meehan showed off a Jets T-shirt with a photo of his military truck. Pizza was gereat and the price was right. The meeting was adjourned at 8:53.




